With over 40 different professions and 20 cutting-edge technologies under one roof, Jaeger-LeCoultre constitutes a watchmaking complex that is unique in the world. Since its establishment, the Manufacture has accumulated hundreds of patents and original achievements, making Jaeger-LeCoultre an inescapable reference in the history of Swiss haute horlogerie.
